Addressed the Schedule Survey. Discussed academic freedom in regards to Dr. Salaita (Dr. Gifford explained).
 - v. VP Paterson-Speaking on behalf of housing and the large enrollment. 7800 students with meal plans, 1900 are off campus. Discussed changes in policy and training available to staff and students.
